What Is Endodontic Therapy? (Root Canal Therapy)

Endodontic therapy is the removing of the nerve and other tissues (called pulp) from inside the tooth and its root(s). It is done by first making an opening through the chewing surface of the tooth to gain access to the tooth's pulp. The contents of the canals are removed and the canals are cleaned, shaped and sterilized. The canals are then filled and sealed with an inert, rubbery material called gutta percha.

Why Do I Need Endodontic Therapy?

Endodontic therapy is necessary when the pulp becomes inflamed or infected. The inflammation or infection can have a variety of causes: deep decay, repeated dental procedures on the tooth, a crack, or chip in the tooth. Trauma to a tooth may cause pulp damage even if the tooth has no visible chips or cracks. If the tooth is left untreated it can cause pain, lead to an abscess, or possible extraction of the tooth.

What Is An Endodontist?

An Endodontist is a dentist who specializes in endodontic therapy (root canal therapy). Endodontists must receive a doctorate degree in dentistry as well as complete an additional two year residency specializing in Endodontics. An endodontist only performs endodontic procedures in their practice.

Will I Feel Pain During Or After The Procedure?

You will be comfortable during the procedure due to advanced techniques and local anesthetics. If any discomfort is felt, the endodontist can quickly anesthetize the tooth to relieve any discomfort you may have. Once the procedure has been completed, it is possible that your tooth may be sensitive while chewing for several days or longer. However, these symptoms may be readily managed with modern medication. Most patients may return to work following completion of endodontic therapy.

How Many Visits Will Endodontic Therapy Take?

Endodontic therapy for most patients can be completed in one visit. In some difficult cases, you may need to return to the office for a second visit to finish treatment on the tooth.

Do I Need To Return To My General Dentist Following My Treatment?

You will need to return to your general dentist once endodontic therapy has been completed for the appropriate restoration. The restoration will restore the tooth to its proper function. This restoration may include a crown or permanent filling.
